CITY COUNCIL NEWS

A regular meeting of the City Council of City of Auburn, Iowa was held on the 10th day April of 2017. Mayor Richard Heim called the meeting to order at 6:00 pm with a roll call as following; Present: Cindy Finley, Jane Barto, and Bob Theulen. Absent: Potthoff and Schulte. A motion was made by Councilor Theulen and seconded by Councilor Finley approving the consent Agenda including minutes, agenda, sheriff's report, payroll, and claims for payment. Ayes: Finley, Theulen, and Barto. Nays: None. Absent: Potthoff and Schulte. Motion carried.

City Council reviewed Engineering RFQ and Bill Goldy of ISG Engineering Service reviewed doing a Capital Improvement Plan verses an Engineering Study on city's utility systems and streets. City requested that ISG send a quote to do a Capital Improvement Plan and the council would review it at the next regular city council meeting.

City Council reviewed the survey of Part E ½ NE ¼ section 23, T-86N, R35-W in the City of Auburn.

Resolution 17-06 – approving a proclamation encouraging citizens to undertake personal and organizational efforts that will enhance the cleanliness, health and beauty in Auburn was offered by Councilor Finley and seconded by Councilor Theulen. On a roll call vote. Ayes: Finley, Barto, and Theulen. Nays: None. Absent: Schulte and Potthoff.

A motion was made by Councilor Barto and seconded by Councilor Finley setting a public hearing for budget amendments for FY17 on May 8th, 2017 @6:00pm. Ayes: Barto, Finley, and Theulen. Nays: None. Absent: Schulte and Potthoff. Motion carried.

Reports were given by City Clerk, City Council, Hometown Pride, and Sac Co Solid Waste Board.

A motion was made by Councilor Barto and seconded by Councilor Finley to adjourn the meeting.
